Since it is a harvest celebration, we will be sharing what we harvest. We ask that those in attendance bring something to share with others. Baskets will be provided for fruit, veggies, flowers, herbs, baked goods...whatever you feel you want to share. After the service, all are asked to take something from the baskets and thank nature for the gift. There is no worship service at the church this morning.

August 13: Norm Grenier The Occult & Science: Carl Jung's View

In our scientific age, instances of "strange happenings" are quickly tossed into the trash heap of fiction. However, Carl Jung, the Swiss psychologist, had a different view. He asserted that the irrational, simply because it was irrational, deserved a closer look. Come this Sunday and see what his close observation of unusual phenomena discovered and the doors it opened. Today's service will be conducted by Normand Grenier, a long-time student of Jung and an advanced student at the Jungian Institute of Ontario.

August 20: Andrea Priest Healing Songs

This summer service will bring you words by Anne Lammott from her newly released book, *Hallelujah Anyway*. The service will be intermingled with our own hymns from the UU hymnals. The theme will be from a workshop Andrea attended at the Rowe Conference Center, *On the Breath of Song: The Practice of Bedside Singing*. Participants can join in on the singing seated comfortably or just listen to the sounds and experience the healing songs can bring.

RELIGIOUS EXPLORATION


Myles Standish Summer Picnic – Saturday, August 5
